October 6, 2021

The Regular Meeting of the Bucks County Board of Commissioners was held today at 10:30 am, in the Bucks County Commissioners' Meeting Room, 55 E. Court Street, Doylestown, Pennsylvania. VII. CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER REPORT

Margie McKevitt, Chief Operating Officer, reported on the following:

Human Services has released its application for funding for the American Rescue Plan Act. Currently available on the Human Services main page, applications will be accepted through Friday, October 29th. There will be an information session via Zoom on Monday, October 18th from 12 to 1:30 pm.

A Bucks business round table discussion will be held on Friday, October 15th. How the COVID relief funding will be used will be discussed and feedback from businesses will be received.

The County is updating its 2011 Comprehensive Plan and two sessions are scheduled to receive feedback from the public: On October 12th at the Quakertown Borough Hall and on October 27th at the Lower Makefield Township building. Both sessions will run from 7 to 9 pm.

VIII. SOLICITOR REPORT

Solicitor Joe Khan reported on Executive Sessions held since the last Commissioners' Meeting:

- September 21st – Special Executive Session to discuss the ongoing opioid litigation and to receive legal advice concerning possible real estate leasing.
- October 5th – Standing Executive Session to receive information from staff

and legal counsel, and to discuss personnel matters and potential leasing issues.

Noting the on-going cost of continuing legal education and license renewals required for attorneys, Mr. Khan advised that the Law Department recently conducted the county's first continuing legal education (CLE) course. This was attended by attorneys in the Law Department as well as members of the local bar association. This training for in-house attorneys resulted in no cost to the county and will bring in revenue as the program expands.

Mr. Khan reported on the ongoing litigation by the Drug & Alcohol Service Providers of Pennsylvania against the Commonwealth. He advised that a hearing on the injunction motion is scheduled before the Commonwealth Court in Harrisburg on October 28th.

IX. COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

Commissioner Harvie spoke about Dan Fraley, wishing him well on his retirement. He noted Mr. Fraley's service in Vietnam and subsequent service to the community, and he reflected on the treatment Vietnam veterans had received in the past.

Noting the proclamation for Fire Prevention Week, Commissioner Harvie reminded everyone to check their smoke alarms and to reach out to their local fire department with any issues.

Referencing a recent headline in the local newspapers that could be considered misleading, Commissioner Harvie offered assurance that the Bucks County ballots went in the mail yesterday. He added that people still have time to apply for a mail-in ballot.

Commissioner Harvie spoke about Breast Cancer Awareness Month. He noted the importance of early detection and urged everyone to see their doctor as soon as they have concerns.

Commissioner DiGirolamo brought up the upcoming election and said that the Board of Elections staff has been diligently preparing. He reported on an election forum that was recently held at Bucks County Community College and said that compromise is needed to enact the changes to the election laws that are needed. He noted the need for pre-canvassing of ballots so elections staff can open envelopes and scan them as they come in.

Speaking about the continuing opioid epidemic, Commissioner DiGirolamo reported on the number of people coming into the prison system needing to be detoxed.

Commissioner Marseglia invited Bernard Griggs, Project and Diversity Officer, to speak about the 3rd Annual Love is the Answer Day mural project. Mr. Griggs presented a video and shared information about this project in support of peace and reconciliation.

X. BRIEF PUBLIC COMMENTS – All Items

Megan Brock from Northampton Township read emails related to mask mandates in schools.

Jamie Walker from New Britain spoke about the mask mandates in schools.
