VII. CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER REPORT

Margie McKevitt, Chief Operating Officer, thanked Dave Boscola and his team, as well as all the department heads, division leaders, courts, and row offices for all their

work on the 2022 budget.

Solicitor Joe Khan reported on Executive Sessions held since the last Commissioners' Meeting:

Mr. Khan provided an update on the Law Department's efforts to obtain Mansfield Certification, which is a national certification that recognizes law departments that are proactive in fair consideration for hiring, promotions, and serving on high profile cases. He also reported that the advisory group, a law firm advisory committee comprised of members of the Bucks County Bar Association, has been meeting weekly for the past few months. Mr. Khan announced that the committee just completed its work, and he thanked the members by name for their valuable service to the County.

Commissioner DiGirolamo said he was in awe of all that Dr. Diamond has been able to accomplish and his travels around the world. The commissioner noted that agriculture is still the #1 driver of the economy in Pennsylvania.

Commissioner Marseglia said it has been an honor serving as Chair for these past two years and she reflected on all they have been able to accomplish. She thanked everyone for all their hard work and said she is looking forward to positive things 2022.

Upon motion of Commissioner Harvie, seconded by Commissioner DiGirolamo, with the vote being 3-0, the meeting was adjourned.
