

BUCKS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES

January 19, 2022

I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Regular Meeting of the Bucks County Board of Commissioners was held today at 10:30 am, in the Bucks County Commissioners' Meeting Room, 55 E. Court Street, Doylestown, Pennsylvania. In attendance were Commissioner Robert J. Harvie, Chair; Commissioner Diane M. Ellis-Marsegia, Vice Chair; and Commissioner Gene DiGirolamo, Secretary. Commissioner Harvie welcomed everyone to the meeting and Brian Munroe, Clerk of Courts, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Ms. Jackman spoke about combatting human trafficking and unfair labor practices; the Health Department's role with inspections and licensing; and enforcement of the ordinance by law enforcement. Consumer Protection Director Mike Bannon spoke about the new Compliance Investigator position that was recently created, which will assist with responses to complaints and inquiries regarding these establishments.

VII. CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER REPORT

Chief Operating Officer Margie McKevitt thanked the Health Department and Emergency Management for coordinating the distribution of COVID-19 rapid tests. They have been distributing 1,000 kits per hour today at Sesame Place in Middletown. Tomorrow they will be in Warminster Park and next Monday, January 24th, they will be at the Calvary Church in Souderton. The hours of distribution each day are from 10 am to 6 pm. See website for additional times and information.

Deputy COO/Chief Clerk Gail Humphrey provided information regarding mail-in ballot applications. She advised a letter will be sent out within the next few weeks with instructions to apply for a mail-in ballot for both the primary and general elections. The last day to apply to vote for the May 17th primary is May 10th.

VIII. SOLICITOR REPORT

Solicitor Joe Khan reported on the standing Executive Session held the day before the public meeting to discuss personnel matters and pending litigation.

Mr. Khan congratulated the commissioners on being the first county in the state to enact such an ordinance regulating massage establishments. He thanked all those who contributed to make it a reality, including Health Department Director Dr. Damsker, Director of Environmental Health Phil Smith, and Health Department

inspectors; Mr. Bannon and the Consumer Protection Department; and Assistant Solicitor Chelsey Jackman and 1st Assistant Solicitor Amy Fitzpatrick.

Patricia Doeblner from Chalfont requested that the commissioners' meetings be held in the evening and questioned mask requirements in county buildings.

Commissioner Harvie responded to the public comments.

X. COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

Commissioner Marseglia thanked everyone for their support during her recent surgery.

Commissioner Marseglia referenced a discussion at the January 5th meeting regarding a Right-to-Know request that mistakenly yielded an email address for a private citizen. She apologized for that and said that the citizen should not have had to receive the cruel and vicious email that they did receive as a result.

Commissioner Marseglia spoke about the issue of suicide among children and clarified that according to statistics, the pandemic has not had an impact in that way. She added that doesn't mean that there aren't people in the community that are suffering from mental health problems.

Referencing a recent article on conspiracy theories, Commissioner Marseglia explained how some conspiracy theories get started and she encouraged people to get their information from reliable sources.

Commissioner DiGirolamo spoke at length about the pandemic, how difficult it has been for everyone, and all the issues the Board has had to face during the past two years. He said they have always worked together to manage their responsibilities as best they could while always trying to do what was best for the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Bucks County. When businesses were forced to close due to state mandates, the commissioners fought hard to push back and open up the county. The commissioner said that decisions regarding the school districts should stay with the individual districts, and that everyone needs to work together, be respectful of each other, and compromise to find solutions that work for all.

Commissioner Harvie reflected on some of the things the commissioners have been

able to accomplish by working together for the citizens of the county. These included the creation of the HUB, protecting the Delaware River Basin from fracking, passing a 2022 budget with no tax increase, creating a first responder's program, purchasing the first electric county vehicles, preventing evictions, adopting the Ready for 100 Resolution, opening and rebuilding bridges, partnering for the Love is the Answer mural, preserving six farms, preserving Lake Galena in perpetuity, expanding the fresh vegetable program for seniors, providing PPE for early childhood education and daycare centers, providing COVID-19 vaccinations, assisting flood and hurricane victims, holding a job fair for inmates, and implementing a telework policy for county employees. The commissioner said he is looking forward to 2022 and he thanked his colleagues and staff, especially Chief Operating Officer Margie McKevitt for her constant professionalism.

XI. ADJOURNMENT

Upon motion of Commissioner Marseglia, seconded by Commissioner DiGirolamo, with the vote being 3-0, the meeting was adjourned.
